



A Summary of the 2025 International Macrobiotic Conference At La Ferme du Bois le Comte, Orval, Belgium

Travelling to Orval is long and very pleasant indeed. Some came by car, train, camping van, plane... whether from a distance or more close, fine teachers, practitioners and inquirers, gathered happy to create the few days together.

The venue is unique, nestled in South Belgium true countryside where for 29 years Luc and Lieve De Cuyper, and amazing staff, have dedicated their lives to making this traditional farmhouse and the land into a flourishing macrobiotic and wellness centre. Following permaculture principles of caring for the land and growing enough vegetables to cater all the year round for dozens of participants. Having a warm fire indoors and fine simple rooms with every window a view of healthy nature. The walks and fresh air are a delight. The teaching rooms are beautifully simple and large.

Luc welcomed the conference group and provided the big temple room for us to sit, mostly in a circle, for the presentations and sharing. Each one was a gift, with great variety, professional application, depth, and laughter. Jan Vervecken master Shiatsu teacher gave the opening early morning movement. Mieke Vervecken's fine description of Healing gut Microbiome with macrobiotics and Ayurveda. Anna Mackenzie led preparatory shiatsu then chanting, the sound was truly lovely. We toured the land led by Luc De Cuyper as he shared his permaculture wisdom and garden practice. Joska Dubbeldam spoke on Ecovillage. Followed by, all the way from the USA, Sandy Pukel super talk on gratitude which led to an amazing discussion about young people joining the Conference and Macrobiotics in general. After dinner Ignatio played great guitar tunes, no one could resist the power of dance and laughter took over.

Anna Mackenzie began the day - interactive Okido yoga with partners. After breakfast Tamara Kempf a psychologist, created a double session on Emotions Matter, Reclaiming a vital part of life. We worked with each other and the insights were fascinating. Sunny lunch then Isabel Corthier 8 brocades Qigong brought gentle inner focus and stretch and breathing. Mike Chen spoke beautifully on Ohsawa and Let go. Then we went into a smaller room to hold a little remembrance circle dedicated to Georges Van Wesenbeeck who had given so much to macrobiotics and was on the committee and worked with Luc. Mieke and Jan had brought sunflowers that were the centre piece and they led the honouring ceremony. Suzanne Severijns came the day before to join us. Annick, Marike de Coninck, Carin and Hilke also dear friends from Belgium and Holland, were a vital part of the conference and much appreciated. Ignacio Aragues played the guitar beautifully in a variety of moods to accompany parts of presentations, talk, remembrance and party.
